


- 1. Candidates can apply for AIPMT- 2014 only "Online".
- 2. Information Bulletin can be downloaded from the website www.aipmt.nic.in.
- 3. Online submission of Application Form may be made by accessing Board website www.aipmt.nic.in.

 Instructions for Online submission of Application Form are available in the Information Bulletin and on the website www.aipmt.nic.in.
- 4. Candidates must follow the instructions strictly as given in the Information Bulletin and on website. Candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disqualified.
- 5. Candidates must retain the following documents with them as reference for future correspondence.
 - (i) At least four printouts of the Confirmation Page of online Application.
 - (ii) Original receipt issued by Post Office for having despatched the Confirmation Page of online Application.
 - (iii) Proof of fee paid

- 6. (a) Please ensure before mailing the print out of the Confirmation Page of online application form that:
 - (i) The applicant has signed the Form at specified place and affixed left hand thumb impression.
 - (ii) The application bears the signature of Parent/Guardian.
 - (iii) The application has been authenticated/signed by the Head of the Institution/Gazetted Officer.
 - (iv) The good quality colour studio photograph with white background (taken on or after 01.12.2013) has been duly pasted in the space earmarked for it. Further, ensure that application form number & candidate name has been written on the back of the photograph.
 - (v) The Confirmation Page of online application sent by Courier shall not be accepted.
 - (b) The fee can be remitted in the following ways:
 - (i) By Credit Card/Debit Card
 - (ii) Remittance through Challan by depositing in CBSE Account with Canara Bank or Syndicate Bank or e-Post Office.

- 1. AIPMT- 2014 will be held in single stage and would be an objective test.
- 2. Only one application is to be submitted by a candidate.
- 3. Information regarding receipt of confirmation page of online Applications will be hosted from time to time on website www.aipmt.nic.in. Candidates can check the status of receipt of confirmation page of online Applications on the website and take the suggested action.
- 4. The AIPMT- 2014 will be held on 04.05.2014 (Sunday).

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INFORMATION BULLETIN ALL INDIA PRE-MEDICAL/PRE-DENTAL ENTRANCE TEST-2014

1. INTRODUCTION

In compliance with the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi, would be conducting the All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test 2014, for the academic session 2014-15. This entrance test is being conducted for the 15% merit positions in the Medical/Dental Colleges of India as specified in the directive of the court and will be governed by the rules and regulations specified for the same by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India from time to time.

There are also State Governments/Universities/Institutions voluntarily participating in the All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test 2014 for using its merit list for admission in the Medical Colleges/Dental Colleges against seats under their control.

The responsibility of the CBSE is limited to the conduct of the entrance test, declaration of result and providing merit list to the DGHS and participating States/Universities/Institutions.

The counselling for successful candidates under 15% All India Quota seats is conducted by the DGHS. The Counselling for admission in seats under the control of other participating States/Universities/Institutions shall be conducted as per the notifications issued separately by the authorities concerned.

During counselling, the eligibility criteria, various documents, etc. of the meritorious candidate is verified as per norms specified by the respective authorities and Medical/Dental College is allotted to the candidate according to the choice.

2. SHORT TITLE

These rules will be called as All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test Rules.

3. DEFINITIONS

- **a.** "Government" means Government of India.
- **h.** "Ministry" means Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi.
- c. "DGHS" means Directorate General of Health Services, New Delhi.
- d. "Board" means Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi
- e. "Medical Examination & AIPMT" means All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Examination.
- **f.** "Qualifying Examination" means Examinations on the result of which the candidate becomes eligible to apply for admission to the All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Examination.
- **g.** "Rules" means the rules specified by the Central Board of Secondary Education for the conduct of this examination under the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare as well as Medical Council of India.
- **h.** "Scheduled Castes" means Scheduled Castes as specified and laid down by the Government of India or any of the States/UTs Government.
- **i.** "Scheduled Tribes" means Scheduled Tribes as specified and laid down by the Government of India or any of the States/UTs Government.
- **j. "Other Backward Classes"** means Other Backward Classes as specified and laid down by the Government of India or any of the States/UTs Government.
 - **"Physically Handicapped"** means Physically Handicapped person as specified and laid down by the Government of India.
- k. "Council" means Medical Council of India and Dental Council of India.
- **l.** "Eligible Candidate" means a candidate who satisfies the requirement of eligibility as prescribed by Medical Council of India and Dental Council of India.

4. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- (a) All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test will be governed by the rules and regulations specified by the Central Board of Secondary Education, Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India and the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India.
- (b) Appearance in AIPMT does not confer any right to the candidate for admission in MBBS/BDS Courses. The selection and admission to MBBS/BDS seats in any Medical Institution recognized for running MBBS/BDS Courses as per Indian Medical Council Act 1956 and BDS Course Regulations 2007 is subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility, medical fitness and such other criteria as may be prescribed by the Government of India, respective States, Universities and Medical Institutions.
- (c) Applications of candidates submitting false and fabricated information will not be considered and such candidates will be further debarred from appearing in any future examinations conducted by the CBSE.
- (d) Incomplete application or applications not in accordance with instructions will not be considered and are liable to be rejected. The examination fee deposited will not be refunded in such cases.
- (e) Fee will neither be carried forward to a future Examination nor refunded under any circumstances. Online applications and/or their confirmation of submission received after the due date will not be entertained and exam fee will not be returned in such cases. Applications once submitted cannot be withdrawn.
- (f) Instructions in the Information Bulletin are liable to change based on decisions taken by the CBSE from time to time. There is no equity or any rights that are/or deemed to be arising in favour of candidates.
- (g) CBSE reserves the right to withdraw permission, if any, granted inadvertently to any candidate who is not eligible to appear in the AIPMT-2014 even though the Roll Number and Admit Card have been issued by the Board.
- (h) Candidate's eligibility is purely provisional and is subject to fulfilment of eligibility criteria as prescribed by the Board.
- (i) In case of any ambiguity in interpretation of any of the instructions/terms/rules/criteria regarding determination of eligibility/conduct of examination/registration of candidates/information contained therein, the interpretation of the CBSE shall be final and binding.

5. PATTERN OF AIPMT 2014

(i) Pattern of the Entrance Test:-

The Entrance Test shall consist of one paper containing 180 objective type questions (four options with single correct answer) from **Physics, Chemistry and Biology** (**Botany & Zoology**) to be answered on the specially designed machine-gradable sheet using Ball Point Pen only. **The duration of paper would be 03 hours.**

(ii) Language of the Question Papers:-

- Candidates can opt for Question Paper either in **English** or in **Hindi**.
- Option of Question Paper should be exercised while filling in the application form and the option once exercised by candidates cannot be changed later.
- > Candidates opting for English would be provided Test Booklet in English only and the candidates opt for Hindi would be provided Test Booklet in both Hindi and English, i.e., Bilingual.
- > In case of any ambiguity in translation of any of the questions, its English version shall be treated as final.

6. DATE OF ENTRANCE TEST

All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test (AIPMT), 2014 will be conducted on Sunday the 04th May 2014 from 10:00 am to 01:00 pm. (The duration of paper would be 3 hours)

The schedule will remain unaltered even if the above date is declared a public holiday.

7. SYLLABUS FOR THE TEST:

The Question Papers for the test shall be based on a common syllabus notified by the Medical council of India. Please see Appendix - X for details.

8. CENTRES FOR ENTRANCE TEST

- (i) List of cities where the AIPMT 2014 will be conducted is given at Appendix 1.
- (ii) The Candidate should select Three Convenient City Codes for the entrance Test from Appendix I.
- (iii) Though every effort will be made to allot a centre in one of the places selected by the candidate, yet the Board reserves its discretion to allot a centre other than the candidate's choice.
- (iv) Allotment of centre is made by Computer and there is no human intervention. **Under no circumstances** the choice of centre cities filled in the application form shall be changed by the Board.

9. ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS

9.1 Eligibility for 15% All India Quota Seats

- (i) He/she has completed age of 17 years at the time of admission or will complete the age on or before 31st December of the year of his/her admission to the 1st year MBBS/BDS Course and is an INDIAN NATIONAL.
- (ii) The upper age limit for candidates seeking admission under 15% All India Quota Seats is 25 years as on 31st December of the year of the entrance examination. Further provided that this upper age limit shall be relaxed by a period of 5 (five) years for the candidates of Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes/Other Backward Classes. Candidate must born on or between
 - (a) 01.01.85 to 01.01.98 (SC/ST/OBC Category)
 - (b) 01.01.90 to 01.01.98 (Other Category)

(iii) Candidates from Andhra Pradesh and J&K

- (a) Students from the States of Andhra Pradesh and J&K are NOT ELIGIBLE for 15% all India quota seats as both these States had opted out of All India Scheme since its inception. If they claim eligibility, they must submit an affidavit, in original, as per proforma given in Appendix II, on non-judicial Stamp Paper of Rs 10/- duly sworn in before and attested by a Metropolitan Magistrate/First Class Judicial Magistrate to the effect that:
 - i) They are not eligible to seek admission for MBBS/BDS seats in Medical/ Dental Colleges in the States of Andhra Pradesh and J&K.
 - ii) They are not domiciled in Andhra Pradesh and J&K.
- (b) Applications not accompanied with the required affidavits as per format given at Appendix II or accompanied with incomplete, unattested or photocopy of the affidavit shall be summarily rejected without any further reference in the matter. The affidavits submitted by such candidates will be verified and if found to be false, the admission of all such candidates shall be cancelled and criminal proceedings may be initiated against them.

9.2 Eligibility for seats under the control of participating States/Universities/Institutions and AFMC

- **a.** He/she has completed age of 17 years at the time of admission or will complete the age on or before 31st December of the year of his/her admission to the 1st year MBBS/BDS Course and is an INDIAN NATIONAL.
- b. Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) may also appear in AIPMT for admission in seats under the control of participating States/Universities/Institutions subject to rules and regulations of the Government of India, respective State Governments and the University/Institution concerned. OCI candidates may verify eligibility norms of participating States/Universities/Institutions before applying for AIPMT 2014
- **c.** The upper age limit for candidates seeking admission under seats in the control of participating States/Universities/Institutions shall be as per their rules and regulations.
- d. Candidates from the States of Jammu & Kashmir and Andhra Pradesh can appear in AIPMT for admission to AFMC, Pune.

9.3 Qualifications and Qualifying Examination Codes:

CODE: 01

A candidate who is appearing in the qualifying examination, i.e., 12th Standard in 2014 whose result is awaited, may apply and take up the said test but he/she shall not be eligible for admission to the MBBS or BDS, if he/she does not pass the qualifying examination with the required pass percentage of marks at the time of first round of Counselling.

CODE: 02

The Higher/Senior Secondary Examination or the Indian School Certificate Examination which is equivalent to 10+2 Higher/Senior Secondary Examination after a period of 12 years study, the last two years of such study comprising of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology (which shall include practical tests in these subjects) and Mathematics or any other elective subject with English at a level not less than the core course for English as prescribed by the National Council of Educational Research and Training after introduction of the 10+2+3 educational structure as recommended by the National Committee on Education.

NOTE: where the course content is not as prescribed for 10 +2 education structure of the National Committee, the candidates will have to undergo a period of one year pre - professional training before admission to the Medical Colleges.

OR

CODE: 03

The Intermediate/Pre-degree Examination in Science of an Indian University/Board or other recognised examining body with Physics, Chemistry, Biology /Bio-technology (which shall include practical test in these subjects) and also English as a compulsory subject.

OR

CODE: 04

The Pre-professional/Pre-medical Examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology & English after passing either the Higher Secondary Examination or the Pre-University or an equivalent examination. The Pre-professional/Pre-medical examination shall include practical test in these subjects and also English as a compulsory subject.

OR

CODE: 05

The first year of the three years' degree course of a recognised University with Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology including practical tests in these subjects provided the examination is a University Examination and candidate has passed the earlier qualifying examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology with English at a level not less than a core course.

OR

CODE: 06

B.Sc. Examination of an Indian University provided that he/she has passed the B.Sc. Examination with not less than two of the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Biology (Botany, Zoology)/Bio-technology and further that he/ she has passed the earlier qualifying examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English.

OR

CODE: 07

Any other examination which in scope and standard (Last o2 years of 10+2 Study comprising of Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology; Which shall include practical test in these subjects.) is found to be equivalent to the Intermediate Science Examination of an Indian University/Board, taking Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology including practical tests in each of these subjects and English.

Provided that to be eligible for competitive entrance examination, candidate must have passed any of the qualifying examinations as enumerated above or appearing in the qualifying examination in 2014. Provided also that to be eligible for competitive Entrance Test the candidate must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology at the qualifying examination as mentioned in clause (2) of regulation 4 on Graduate Medical Education 1997 and in addition must have come in the merit list of All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test(AIPMT) for admission to MBBS/BDS courses.

In respect of the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes or Other Backward Classes, the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology taken together in qualifying examination shall be 40% marks instead of 50% marks for General Candidates. Further, for persons with locomotory disability of lower limbs, minimum of 45% marks for Gen-PH and 40% marks for SC-PH/ST-PH/OBC-PH are required.

Provided further that the students educated abroad seeking admission into medical colleges in India must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology and English upto the 12th standard level with 50% marks and their equivalency determined as per regulations of the Medical Council of India and the concerned University. If a candidate does not fall within the qualifications prescribed as per Code number o1-07 he/she should furnish complete details to determine eligibility.

Note:

- The Pre-medical course may be conducted either at a Medical College or at a Science College.
- After the 10+2 course is introduced the integrated courses be abolished.
- Marks obtained in Mathematics are not to be considered for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses.

10. ADMISSION AND RESERVATION

An All India merit list of the qualified candidates shall be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in the All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test as mentioned under rule 15 of this Bulletin and candidates shall be admitted to MBBS/BDS courses under 15% All India Quota Seats and seats under the control of participating State Governments/Universities/Institutions from the said list only by following their Reservation Policies and other admission criteria.

10.1 RESERVATION OF SEATS IN GOVERNMENT MEDICAL COLLEGES UNDER 15% ALL INDIA QUOTA:

- (a) 15% seats are reserved for SC candidates,
- (b) 7.5% seats are reserved for ST candidates,
- (c) 27% seats are reserved for non-creamy layer OBC candidates in Central Educational Institutions (Appendix-IX *) only as per Hon'ble Supreme Court order dated 10.04.2008. Reservation would be applicable to the castes mentioned in the Central list of OBC. Thus, the candidates falling in this list may mention OBC in the Category Column in application form. Candidates from creamy layer and do not come under Central List of OBC are advised to mention their category as General.
- (d) 3% seats are reserved on horizontal basis for Physically Handicapped candidates (only for locomotory disabilities of lower limbs between 50% to 70%, provided that in case any seat in this 3% quota remains unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% then any such unfilled seat in this 3% quota shall be filled up by persons with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 40% to 50% before they are included in the seats of respective category) in 15% All India UG quota seat. Detailed information in this regard is available on the website of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare www.mohfw.nic.in Candidates who considered themselves eligible for this category are advised to ensure their eligibility by getting themselves examined at any Government Medical College/District Hospital/Government Hospital. However, candidates may kindly note that in case of selection under PH category, they will be required to produce Disability Certificate from one of the disability assessment boards, constituted at the four metro cities, mentioned below, before their schedule date of counselling:

Reservation will be made as per 2200 point reservation roster. The mode of implementation of reservation will be available on DGHS website-www.mohfw.nic.in.

10.2 ADMISSION IN STATE MEDICAL COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES/INSTITUTIONS/AFMC FOR SEATS OTHER THAN 15% ALL INDIA QUOTA.

- (a) In case a State/University/Institution opts to admit students in its medical colleges from the merit list of AIPMT 2014, it may prepare separate rank list based on All India rank in AIPMT and other criteria decided by it.
- (b) List of States/Universities/Institutions that have decided to use the result of AIPMT 2014 as on the date of publication of this Information Bulletin is at Appendix-VIII. Candidates seeking admission in seats other than 15% All India Quota are advised to visit the websites of State/University/Institution as mentioned at Appendix-VIII and contact their authorities concerned in advance for eligibility criteria and other details for admission.
- (c) Admission to **Armed Forces Medical College (AFMC)**, **Pune** shall be subject to the norms prescribed by the Directorate of Armed Force medical Services, Ministry of Defence, Government of India. Candidates who apply for AIPMT 2014 and also seeking admission in AFMC will have to apply on the website of AFMC www.afmc.nic.in/www.afmc.dg1d.gov.in. The short listed candidates will be required to appear for a second stage Screening conducted by AFMC. Candidates are advised to contact AFMC for further details.

11. STATE CODE OF ELIGIBILITY AND DOMICILE

- (a) List of State Codes is at Appendix IV. For 15% All India Quota seats, candidates may choose State Code(s) on the basis of State to which the applicant belongs.
- (b) Candidate's rank in the merit list for seats under the control of participating States will be generated on the basis of the State Code of Eligibility filled in by the Candidates in the application form.
- (c) Guidelines and Rules regarding Domicile framed by each participating State/University/Institution shall be applicable in respect of the seats under their control.
- (d) Candidates who are eligible for State Quota seats in participating States/UT Appendix VIII may fill State Code Appendix – IV of the concerned State after ensuring his/her eligibility as per criteria prescribed by the participating State.

12. MODE OF SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION FORM AND FEE DETAILS

A candidate can apply for the All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test (AIPMT) **only on-line** by logging on to <u>www.aipmt.nic.in</u>.

Before submission of application form, make the following preparations:

- Candidate should have scanned images of his latest photograph and signature in JPG format only, for uploading as part of submission of online application.
- Decide the mode of payment of fee,
 - Through Debit/Credit Card using on-line gateway payment facility, or
 - Depositing in CBSE Bank Account with Canara Bank or Syndicate Bank directly or depositing in CBSE Account with e-Post Office by downloading the Challan Form from the website of www.aipmt.nic.in.
 - (a) If decided to pay fee through Debit/Credit Card, check the validity of the Card and keep it ready with you while logging on to website for submitting application form.
 - **(b)** If decided to pay fee off-line mode, choose the Bank or e-Post Office for depositing the Fee through Challan/Deposit Slip downloaded from website www.aipmt.nic.in after completing Part-II of Registration.
 - (c) After Depositing Fee in the Bank/e-Post office, the Deposit Slip bearing Application Registration Number, Name and address of the Bank branch with branch code/Post Office with Pin Code where fee is deposited and transaction ID number be kept ready with you while logging on to website for final submission of Part-III of the application form.
 - (d) Print the Confirmation Page of online application after final submission at Part-III of the application form.

- The candidates must note that after submission of the application form it cannot be withdrawn. Claims for refund of application fee will not be entertained.
- The information desired to be filled in the online application may also be kept ready.

Method of Submission of Application Form:

- Log on to website www.aipmt.nic.in
- Download the Information Bulletin and Replica of online Application form to read it carefully to understand eligibility criteria and other requirements for submission of application online.
- Go to the link "Apply On-line" and open the same.
- Read the instructions and procedure for on-line submission of Application Form carefully. At the end of this page, following four links to apply online are given:
 - (a) Fill in the on-line application form Part-I and note down the registration number.
 - (b) Upload images of photograph and signature in JPG format at Part-II of the application.
 - (c) Make payment of fee through Debit/Credit Card or download Challan for payment in the designated accounts of Canara Bank/Syndicate Bank/e-Post Office at Part III.
 - (d) If fee is deposited through Challan, fill in the relevant columns of on-line application form at Part-III furnishing the details of fee deposited.
 - (e) Take print out of Confirmation page(s) at Part IV of online application format to send to CBSE along with copy of proof of fee deposited, if fee is deposited through Challan mode.
- > Open the first link, follow the instructions carefully and submit the information. At the end of this page, two links "Next" and "Reset" are given. If you are satisfied that filled in information is correct then Click "Next" otherwise "Reset". After opening "Next", information submitted can be checked and if information is correct, go for "Submit" otherwise go for "Back".
- After submission of data at Part I, programme will automatically take you to second link for uploading of photograph and signature.
- After uploading of photograph and signature, programme will automatically take you to third link for payment of fee.
- Follow the instructions and remit the fee. After successful remittance of fee and updating of payment particulars online (if fee is remitted through Challan), programme will take you to fourth link to take print out of Confirmation Page.
- Follow the instructions to take the print out of Confirmation Page and Address Slip of the CBSE to be pasted on A5 (12" x 10") Envelope for sending the complete application form to the CBSE. Kindly ensure that at least four copies of the Confirmation Page and one copy of the Address Slip may be got printed. Three copies of the Confirmation page may be kept safely by the candidate for any future need. One copy of the Confirmation Page may be completed as per instructions for sending to the Board. The photocopy of this Confirmation Page along with the proof of fee paid and the original receipt issued by the Post Office may also be kept safely by the candidate.

- All the four links for online submission of application form, uploading of photograph and signature, payment of fee and to take print out of confirmation page can also be used separately.
- The CBSE has also provided the facility of submission of application form with late fees. For this purpose, candidates need to pay Rs.1000/- as late fee in addition to the actual/examination fee. Submission of application form with late fee can also be made only online. Also, the process of submission of application will remain the same as in case of submission of application form without late fee. Even for the application submitted with late fee, last date for sending the print out of the Computer Generated Confirmation Page is fixed. Candidates are required to ensure that Confirmation Page of Online application along with proof of Payment of fee should reach in the CBSE on or before the last date of receipt of application form.
- Facility of submission of application form, uploading of photograph and signature, payment of fee and printing of the Computer Generated Confirmation Page would be ceased at 05.00 p.m. on the last day of each slot. Hence, candidates are required to complete the process within the prescribed duration.
- Even after the successful submission of online application form within due date, if the Computer Generated Confirmation page is not received by the Board on or before the last date or received without requisite fee, the application form of the candidate will be treated as cancelled.
- Candidates are well versed with the technology of online submission of application form and without any help they are capable in submission of application form online. In case, if any candidate is having any problem, such candidate may visit FACILITATION CENTRE fixed by the CBSE in selected schools/Institutions. The services of facilitation centres are free of cost and available only during working hours. The list of the Facilitation Centres is at Appendix VII.

- (i) The candidate, before submitting the application form online, shall satisfy his/her eligibility to appear in the test. The candidate is required to go through the Information Bulletin carefully and acquaint himself/herself with all requirements with regard to the submission of the Application Form.
- (ii) The Candidate should fill his/her complete postal address with the pin code and e-mail address (own or parents only) for further correspondence.
- (iii) It will be the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that he/she fills-in his/her correct postal and e-mail addresses in the Application Form. Candidates must ensure that address given by them be such at which candidate may be able to get the communication till the counselling is over. THE BOARD SHALL NOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSS IN TRANSIT OR FOR AN INCORRECT ADDRESS GIVEN BY THE APPLICANT IN THE APPLICATION FORM. Candidate should not give the address of Coaching Centre in their application form.
- (iv) Candidates should fill Code Number against the column provided for Qualifying Examination passed. If a candidate does not fall within the qualifications prescribed as per Code numbers 02 to 07, he/she should furnish complete details and fill up qualifying examination Code as 01.
 - Candidates appearing in 12th Standard in 2014 should fill up qualifying code as 01.

The photocopy of this Confirmation Page along with the proof of fee paid and the original receipt issued by the Post Office may also be kept safely by the candidate. Candidates may ensure that the application number printed on application and on address slip is similar.

(xii) Date of Birth:

Enter the date, month and year of birth as per English calendar and as recorded in the Secondary Education Board Certificate.

(xiii) Candidates from J&K and Andhra Pradesh are required to give an affidavit as indicated in {9(9.1- iii)} for seats under 15% All India Quota. Appendix-II

(xiv) **Photograph:**

Candidates are advised to take passport size photographs with white background and one post card size (4"x6") photograph. Passport size photographs are to be used to affix on the Confirmation Page of online Application and also for Counselling/Admission. Post Card size photograph will be collected from candidates by Centre Superintendent at Centre during AIPMT Examination. Before affixing photograph on Confirmation Page candidate must write down his/her name, Application Form number and Contact Number on the reverse side of both the photographs with Ball point pen only. Affix one attested recent good quality colour STUDIO photographs with white background in the space earmarked for this in the Confirmation Page. The photograph must be taken on or after 01.12.2013 indicating clearly the name of candidate alongwith the date of taking the photograph as shown below. Photograph should not have cap or goggles.



Spectacles are allowed if being used regularly. **POLAROID** and **COMPUTER** generated photos are not acceptable. The photograph should be attested by the Principal/Head of the Institution or by a Gazetted Officer in such a way that half the signature of the attesting officer should appear on the photograph and the remaining on the Application Form. Attestation should be done at the bottom part of the photograph so that the photograph is not defaced. The photograph should be firmly affixed to the Application Form by gum/fevicol and should not be pinned or stapled. **Applications not complying with these instructions or with unclear photographs are liable to be rejected. Candidates may please note that if it is found that photograph affixed is fabricated i.e. de-shaped or seems to be hand-made or computer made, the form of the candidate will be rejected and the same would be considered as using unfair means practices and candidate would accordingly be dealt with the rules of unfair means.**

- (xv) The candidates are required to put their signature in the appropriate box given in the Confirmation Page in running hand writing and also to affix clear Left Hand Thumb Impression at the appropriate space provided for it. Writing full name in the Box in Capital letters would not be accepted as signature and the Application Form would liable to be rejected. Further, unsigned application/application without clear thumb impression will also be rejected.
- (xvi) Candidate should firmly tie or staple together the confirmation page of his/ her online Application Form and enclosures, if any. Please use any good quality envelope of A5 size and paste the computer generated Boards address slip.
- (xvii) Request for change in any particulars in the online Application shall not be entertained under any circumstances.
- (xviii) Incomplete Applications shall be rejected.
- (xix) Submission of more than one Application Form

Candidates are advised to submit only one Application Form. If a candidate submits more than one Application Form, his/her candidature is liable to be cancelled.

(xx) Status of receipt of Confirmation Page of online Application Form with Fee

Status of receipt of the Confirmation Page of online Application Form with fee in CBSE would be hosted on Board's website. Efforts would be made to host the status of receipt of all Confirmation pages received by the Board on website www.aipmt.nic.in within 15 days time from the date of receipt of the same. No request regarding non-receipt of Application Form would be entertained by the CBSE after lapse of o7 days period from the last date of hosting of information on the website.

Candidates are advised to retain the photocopy of the Computer generated Confirmation Page of the online Application Form, Proof of remitting fee and the original receipt issued by the post office for having despatched the Application Form to the Board.

(xxi) Admit Card:

Candidates are required to download the admit cards from the website and follow the instructions given therein. Candidate may please note that **admit cards will not be sent by the post**. In case of any discrepancy, the candidate should immediately inform the Board. **In such cases, candidates would appear in the examination with the already downloaded admit card.** However, Board will take necessary action to make correction in the record **later**.

- > In no case, the duplicate Admit Card for AIPMT 2014 would be issued at the Examination Centres.
- > Candidate must not mutilate the Admit Card or change any entry made therein.
- > Candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Cards in good condition till admission in Medical/ Dental Colleges is over.
- > CANDIDATES ARE ADVISED TO BE IN TOUCH WITH THE WEBSITE OF AIPMT AND REGULARLY CHECK THEIR E-MAILS FOR LATEST UPDATES AND INFORMATION.

14. INSTRUCTIONS TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE EXAMINATION HALL

14.1 General:

- (i) The Examination Hall will be opened 30 minutes before the commencement of the test. Candidates are expected to take their seats immediately after the opening of the Examination Hall. If the candidates do not report in time, they are likely to miss some of the general instructions to be announced in the Examination Hall.
- (ii) The candidate must show, on demand, the Admit Card for admission in the Examination Hall. A candidate who does not possess the valid Admit Card shall not be admitted to the Examination Hall under any circumstances by the Centre Superintendent.
- (iii) During the examination time, the invigilator will check Admit Card of the candidates to satisfy himself/herself about the identity of each candidate. The invigilator will also put his/her signatures in the place provided in the Answer Sheet on SIDE-1.
- (iv) A seat with a roll number will be allotted to each candidate. Candidates must find out and occupy their allotted seats. If a candidate is found appearing in the Test from a seat or room other than the one allotted to him/her, his/her candidature shall be cancelled.
- (v) A candidate who comes after the commencement of the examination shall not be permitted to appear in the examination.
- (vi) Candidates are not allowed to carry any textual material, printed or written, bits of papers, envelope or any other material except the Admit Card inside the Examination Hall.
- (vii) Calculators, Slide Rules, Log Tables, Geometry Box, Electronic Digital Watches with facilities of calculators, cellular phones, pagers or any other electronic gadget are not allowed inside the Examination Hall.
 - Candidates are advised in their own interest not to bring any of the banned items including Mobile Phone to the venue of the examination as arrangement for safe keeping cannot be assured.
- (viii) No candidate will leave his/her seat or the Examination Room/Hall until the Test concludes as per schedule. Candidates should not leave the Room/Hall without handing over their Answer Sheets to the invigilator on duty. In case of emergency or on medical ground, candidates may take special permission of the Centre Superintendent and Observer on duty and the same should be reported to the Board in writing by the Centre Superintendent and the Observer.

- (ix) Candidates are advised to bring with them a card board or a clip board so that they have no difficulty in marking responses in the Answer Sheet even if the tables provided in the Examination Hall do not have smooth surface. They will also bring their own Ball Point Pens of good quality. These will not be supplied by the Board.
- (x) Smoking in the Examination Hall during examination hours is strictly prohibited.
- (xi) Tea, coffee, cold drinks or snacks are not allowed to be taken by the candidates into the Examination Halls during examination hours.
- (xii) The Test will start exactly at the time mentioned in the Admit Card and an announcement to this effect will be made by the invigilator.
- (xiii) A signal will be given at the beginning of the examination and at half-time. A signal will also be given before the closing time when the candidate must stop marking the responses.
- (xiv) The candidate must sign twice on the Attendance Sheet at the appropriate place, first time immediately after the commencement of Examination and second time while delivering the Answer Sheet to the invigilator. The candidates are also required to put their left hand thumb impression in the space provided on the Attendance Sheet.
- (xv) For those who are unable to appear on the scheduled date of test for any reason, re-test shall not be held by the Board under any circumstances.

14.2 UNFAIR MEANS PRACTICE & BREACHES OF EXAMINATION RULES:

- (1) Unfairmean practice is an activity that allows a candidate to gain an unfair advantage over other candidates. It includes, but not limited to:
 - a) Having in possession papers, books, notes, electronic devices or any other material or information relevant to the examination in the paper concerned;
 - b) Paying someone to write examination (impersonation) or prepare material;
 - c) Breaching examination rules;
 - d) Assisting another candidate to engage in malpractice; -giving or receiving assistance directly or indirectly of any kind or attempting to do so;
 - e) Writing questions or answers on any material other than the answer sheet given by the Centre Superintendent for writing answers;
 - f) Tearing of Answer Sheet, any page of the test booklet, etc.;
 - g) Contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person, other than the Examination Staff, during the examination time in the examination centre;
 - h) Taking away the answer sheet out of the examination hall/room;
 - i) Smuggling out Question Paper or its part or smuggling out answer sheet or part thereof;
 - j) Threatening any of the officials connected with the conduct of the examination or threatening any of the candidates;
 - k) Using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination.
 - I) Manipulation & fabrication in online documents viz. admit card, rank letter, etc.
 - m) Forceful entry in Examination Hall with mala fide intentions.
 - n) Affixing of fabricated photograph on the application form.

(2) PUNISHMENT FOR USING UNFAIRMEANS PRACTICE

- During the course of examination, before or later on, if a candidate is found indulged in any of the above or similar practices, shall be deemed to have used unfair practices at examination and marked as UNFAIRMEANS (U.F.M.). Such candidates would be debarred from taking this examination permanently in future and shall also be liable for criminal action and /or any other action as deem fit by the Board.
- (3) Candidates should ensure before leaving the Examination Hall that they have handed over the Answer Sheet to the invigilators on duty and that they have signed on the Attendance Sheet second time. In case the candidate does not hand over the Answer Sheet and takes away the same with him/ her, this shall amount to use of unfair means practices and accordingly his/her case shall be dealt with.
- (4) The candidate will check and ensure that the Test-Booklet contain as many number of pages as are written on the top of the cover page.

14.3 INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- (1) Parents/Guardians are advised to ensure that their ward should not indulge in unfairmeans activities/malpractices which breach the examination rules. If any candidate is found to be indulged in any such activity he/she shall be debarred from taking this examination permanently in future and shall also be liable for criminal action and/or any other action deem fit by the Board.
- (2) The conduct of AIPMT Examination would be video graphed. The candidates are required to keep their head in upright position and face the camera during the videography so that their identity could be clearly established.
- (3) It is mandatory for the candidate to bring his/her postcard size (4"X6") photograph during the conduct of AIPMT Examination. Photograph should have white background only. On the reverse side of the photograph, candidate must mention his/her name, Application Form number, roll number of Examination. This photograph will be collected by the Invigilator concerned after matching the photograph with the candidate appearing in the Examination.
- (4) Candidates are required to affix clear thumb Impression in the confirmation page of online application form before submitting to the Board and also in the Attendance Sheet at the examination hall for verification of Identity.

14.4 The Test-Booklet:

- (i) Fifteen minutes before the commencement of the test each candidate will be given sealed Test Booklet.
- (ii) Immediately on receipt of the Test Booklet the candidates will fill in the required particulars on the cover page of the Test Booklet with Ball Point Pen only. Candidate will not open the Test Booklet until asked to do so by the invigilator.
- (iii) Five minutes before the commencement of the Test, the Candidate will be asked to break/ open the seal of the Test Booklet. Candidate will take out the Answer Sheet carefully. The Candidate should check carefully that the Test Booklet Code printed on Side-2 of the Answer Sheet is the same as printed on Test Booklet. In case of discrepancy, the candidate should immediately report the matter to the invigilator for replacement of both the Test Booklet and the Answer Sheet.
- (iv) Candidate will then write particulars with ball point pen on both the sides. After completing this step the candidate will wait for the signal by the invigilator.
- (v) After completing the Test and before handing over the Answer Sheet, the candidate should check again that all the particulars required in the Answer Sheet have been correctly written and marked.

14.5 The Answer Sheet

- (i) The Answer Sheet will be found placed inside the sealed Test Booklet. The seal will be broken/ opened by the candidate on the announcement by the invigilator and only then the Answer Sheet shall be taken out. **Do not open/break the seal before the announcement.**
- (ii) Side-2 of each Answer Sheet will have a pre-printed Test Booklet Code A, B, C and D. The candidates are required to check that the Test Booklet code pre-printed on SIDE-2 of the Answer Sheet is the same as printed on the Test Booklet.
- (iii) The format of the Answer Sheet which will be found placed inside the Test Booklet and which will be used for answering questions is given in Appendix-VI. Candidates are advised to go through it and be conversant with the requirements of giving particulars and marking the answers.
- (iv) The Answer Sheet used will be of special type which will be scanned on Optical Scanner. There will be two sides of the Answer Sheet.
 - (a) Side 1 This side of the Answer Sheet contains the following columns which are to be filled in neatly and accurately by the candidate with Blue/Black ball point pen only. Use of pencil on OMR sheet is not allowed. OMR sheet filled in with pencil would be summarily rejected for evaluation.
 - (i) Roll Number
 - (ii) Name of the candidate
 - (iii) Father's Name
 - (iv) Centre Number
 - (v) Name of the Examination Centre
 - (vi) Signature of the candidate

- (b) Side 2 This side of the Answer Sheet contains the following columns which are also to be filled in by the candidate with Blue/Black Ball Point Pen only:
 - (i) Roll Number
 - (ii) Centre Number
 - (iii) Test Booklet Number
 - (iv) Question oo1 to 180

Each column corresponds to the serial number of question given in the Test Booklet. With each column there are four circles which correspond to the four alternative responses, one of which is correct or most appropriate.

(v) WRITING OF PARTICULARS AND RESPONSES ON SIDE-2 WITH BLUE/ BLACK BALL POINT PEN ONLY

Roll Number - Write and mark your Roll Number as per specimen **Answer Sheet. For example Roll No.1252735** Centre Number - Write and mark your Centre No. as per specimen Answer Sheet. For example Centre No. 1126. Test Booklet No. - Write and mark your Test Booklet number as indicated on the Test Booklet as per specimen **Answer Sheet. For example Test Booklet No.** 135364

14.6 Marking the Responses

- (i) Use Blue/Black Ball Point Pen only to darken the appropriate circle. **Answers marked with pencil would not be evaluated.**
- (ii) Mark should be dark and should completely fill the circle.
- (iii) Darken only one circle for each entry as the Answer once marked is not liable to be changed.
- (iv) A lightly or faintly darkened circle will be treated as a wrong method of marking and will be rejected by the Optical Scanner.
- (v) Make the marks only in the space provided.
- (vi) There will be four alternatives for each of the question numbering 001 to 180 in AIPMT Examination. The candidate will indicate response to the question by darkening the appropriate circle completely with Ball Point Pen. For example, Question No. 027 in the Test Booklet reads as follows:

Question No. 027: Taj Mahal is situated in

- (1) Agra
- (2) Mumbai
- (3) Delhi
- (4) Bangaluru

The correct response to this question is (1) Agra. The candidate will locate question No. 027 in the Answer Sheet and darken the circle

027 (2) (3)

If the candidate does not want to attempt any question, he/she should not darken the circle given against that question. Please do not fold the Answer Sheet and do not make any stray mark on it.

14.7 Changing an Answer is not allowed

The candidates must fully satisfy themselves about the accuracy of the answer before darkening the appropriate circle as no change in answer once marked is allowed. Use of eraser or white fluid on the Answer Sheet is not permissible as the Answer Sheets are machine gradable and it may lead to wrong evaluation.

If more than one circle is darkened or if the response is marked in any manner as shown above (or in any other similar manner) heading indicating wrong method shall be treated as wrong way of marking.

14.8 Scoring and Marking

- (a) Each item carries 4 marks. For each correct response the candidate will get 4 marks. For each incorrect response one mark will be deducted from the total score. No deduction from the total score will, however, be made if no response is indicated for an item in the answer sheet. The candidates are advised not to attempt such item in answer sheet, if they are not sure of the correct response. More than one answer indicated a question will be deemed as incorrect response and will be negatively marked.
- (b) For the purpose of evaluation, the Test Booklet code as printed in the Answer Sheet on side-2 will be accepted as final.

14.9 Rough Work

The candidate will not do any rough work or writing work on the Answer Sheet. All rough work is to be done in the Test Booklet itself.

15. MERIT LIST AND QUALIFYING CRITERIA

(i) The Central Board of Secondary Education will prepare the list of successful candidates of AIPMT 2014 on the basis of the eligibility criteria provided by the Medical Council of India as given in Graduate Medical Education Regulations-1997 issued under All India Medical Council Act-1956. The eligibility criteria is as follows:

Under clause (2) to (4) of MCI's regulation, a candidate must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology at the qualifying examination as mentioned in clause (2) of regulation 4 and in addition must have come in the merit list prepared as a result of such competitive Entrance Testby securing not less than 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry, Biology taken together in the competitive examination.

In respect of the candidates belonging to the SC, ST and OBC category the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology taken in qualifying examination and competitive examination (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) be 40% marks instead of 50% for General Candidates.

Further, for persons with locomotory disability of lower limbs, the minimum of 45% marks for Gen-PH and 40% marks for SC-PH/ST-PH/OBC-PH are required. Provided that a candidate who has appeared in the qualifying examination the result of which has not been declared, he may be provisionally permitted to take up the competitive Entrance Testand in case of selection for admission to the MBBS course, he shall not be admitted to that course until he fulfils the eligibility criteria under Regulation(4).

A list of the successful candidates in order of merit based on the score obtained in the examination will be prepared by the Board and forwarded to the counselling authorities for the purpose of allotment of seats.

(ii) The inter-se-merit of candidates for tie-breaking:

- In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks in the AIPMT 2014, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be determined in order of preference as follows:
 - (a) Candidates obtaining higher marks in Biology (Botany & Zoology) in the Test.
 - (b) Candidates obtaining higher marks in Chemistry in the **Test**.
 - (c) Candidates with less number of attempted wrong answers in all the subjects in the **Test.**
 - (d) Candidates older in age to be preferred.

(iii) Merit/Wait List for Counselling under 15% All India Quota:

The merit list of the eligible and successful Candidates who have opted for 15% All India quota seats will be prepared by the CBSE on the basis of score obtained in the AIPMT 2014. The merit list will be equal to the number of seats available for allotment in MBBS/BDS courses under 15% All India Quota. There shall also be a waiting list equal to 4 times of the merit list. The list of successful candidates (Merit List/ Waiting List) shall be forwarded to the Directorate General of Health Services (Medical Examination Cell), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India for the purpose of allotment of seats by Online Counselling.

(iv) Merit List for seats other than 15% All India Quota

- a. Based on the information in respect of State code of eligibility and domicile filled in by the candidates in the application form and the score obtained by the candidates in the AIPMT 2014, CBSE will prepare State level merit list of successful candidates for each participating state. The list of successful candidates shall be forwarded to the Directorate of Medical Education of the State concerned for the purpose of allotment of seats by online counselling/personal appearance by following the rules and reservation policies applicable to the State/UT concerned.
- **b.** All participating Medical Institutions and Universities shall prepare their own ranking based on the All India merit list of successful candidates of AIPMT 2014 and other criteria as decided by them.
- c. The list of successful candidates of AIPMT who have opted for AFMC shall be forwarded to the Directorate General of Armed Force Medical Service, Ministry of Defence, Government of India for second stage screening and counselling.

16. DECLARATION OF RESULT

The Central Board of Secondary Education will conduct the **AIPMT** Examination, evaluate the Answer Sheets and likely to declare the result by the **end of 1**st **week of June, 2014** and the same will be hosted on website www.aipmt.nic.in. The CBSE will prepare the merit list/ wait list as per the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, DGHS, MCI and DCI.

There will be no separate result list of SC/ST candidates. As soon as the result is ready, CBSE will host the results on the website and thereafter candidates may download the Result Sheets.

All Candidates appearing in AIPMT 2014 Examination must remain in touch with the websites of CBSE, MOHFW, Medical Counselling Committee and Participating States/Universities/Institutions till conclusion of final round of Counselling.

16.1 DISPLAY OF OMR SHEETS AND RESPONSES ON WEBSITE

- (i) The CBSE will display the images of OMR Answer Sheets and Responses graded by the Machine of all the candidates on the website www.aipmt.nic.in prior to declaration of result. The OMR answer sheets are likely to be displayed for any five days between dates 25th May to 31st May, 2014.
- (ii) Candidates will be given an opportunity to submit representation against the OMR grading on payment of Rs.1000/- per response challenged. Rs.1000/- per response will be refunded to candidate if his/her challenge is accepted by the Board.
- (iii) All candidates are advised to remain in touch with the website www.aipmt.nic.in for viewing and downloading of his/her answer sheet and responses captured by the machines.

16.2 RULES FOR RE-CHECKING/RE-EVALUATION OF ANSWER SHEETS

The machine - gradable Answer Sheets are evaluated with extreme care and are repeatedly scrutinised. There is no provision for re-checking/re-evaluation of the answer sheets. **No correspondence in this regard will be entertained.**

16.3 LEGAL JURISDICTION

All disputes pertaining to the conduct of examination and allotment of seats shall fall within the jurisdiction of Delhi only. The Secretary of the Board shall be the legal person in whose name the Board may sue or may be sued.

17 WEEDING OUT RULES

The records of All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Test are preserved till the 31st August of the year of conduct of examination.

18 INSTRUCTION FOR COUNSELLING:

18.1 Counselling for seats under 15% All India Quota:

Online counselling would be conducted by the Directorate General of Health Services. Information for online counselling would also be available on DGHS website. Candidates placed in Merit/ Wait List are advised to read the counselling information bulletin carefully and understand the course of action to be taken by them for appearing in the Counselling. 

CONTENTS CLASS XI SYLLABUS

UNIT I: Physical World and Measurement

- Physics: Scope and excitement; nature of physical laws; Physics, technology and society.
- Need for measurement: Units of measurement; systems of units; SI units, fundamental and derived units. Length, mass and time measurements; accuracy and precision of measuring instruments; errors in measurement; significant figures.
- Dimensions of physical quantities, dimensional analysis and its applications.

UNIT II: Kinematics

- Frame of reference, Motion in a straight line; Position-time graph, speed and velocity. Uniform and non-uniform motion, average speed and instantaneous velocity. Uniformly accelerated motion, velocity-time and position-time graphs, for uniformly accelerated motion (graphical treatment).
- Elementary concepts of differentiation and integration for describing motion. *Scalar and vector quantities:* Position and displacement vectors, general vectors, general vectors and notation, equality of vectors, multiplication of vectors by a real number; addition and subtraction of vectors. Relative velocity.
- Unit vectors. Resolution of a vector in a plane-rectangular components.
- Scalar and Vector products of Vectors. Motion in a plane. Cases of uniform velocity and uniform acceleration-projectile motion. Uniform circular motion.

UNIT III: Laws of Motion

- Intuitive concept of force. Inertia, Newton's first law of motion; momentum and Newton's second law of motion; impulse; Newton's third law of motion. Law of conservation of linear momentum and its applications.
- Equilibrium of concurrent forces. Static and Kinetic friction, laws of friction, rolling friction, lubrication.
- Dynamics of uniform circular motion. Centripetal force, examples of circular motion (vehicle on level circular road, vehicle on banked road).

UNIT IV: Work, Energy and Power

- Work done by a constant force and variable force; kinetic energy, work-energy theorem, power.
- Notion of potential energy, potential energy of a spring, conservative forces; conservation of mechanical energy (kinetic
 and potential energies); non-conservative forces; motion in a vertical circle, elastic and inelastic collisions in one and two
 dimensions.

UNIT V: Motion of System of Particles and Rigid Body

- Centre of mass of a two-particle system, momentum conservation and centre of mass motion. Centre of mass of a rigid body; centre of mass of uniform rod.
- Moment of a force,-torque, angular momentum, conservation of angular momentum with some examples.
- Equilibrium of rigid bodies, rigid body rotation and equation of rotational motion, comparison of linear and rotational motions; moment of inertia, radius of gyration. Values of M.I. for simple geometrical objects (no derivation). Statement of parallel and perpendicular axes theorems and their applications.

UNIT VI: Gravitation

• Kepler's laws of planetary motion. The universal law of gravitation. Acceleration due to gravity and its variation with altitude and depth.

 Gravitational potential energy; gravitational potential. Escape velocity, orbital velocity of a satellite. Geostationary satellites.

UNIT VII: Properties of Bulk Matter

- Elastic behavior, Stress-strain relationship. Hooke's law, Young's modulus, bulk modulus, shear, modulus of rigidity, poisson's ratio; elastic energy.
- Viscosity, Stokes' law, terminal velocity, Reynold's number, streamline and turbulent flow. Critical velocity, Bernoulli's theorem and its applications.
- Surface energy and surface tension, angle of contact, excess of pressure, application of surface tension ideas to drops, bubbles and capillary rise.
- Heat, temperature, thermal expansion; thermal expansion of solids, liquids, and gases. Anomalous expansion. Specific heat capacity: Cp, Cv- calorimetry; change of state latent heat.
- Heat transfer- conduction and thermal conductivity, convection and radiation. Qualitative ideas of Black Body Radiation, Wein's displacement law, and Green House effect.
- Newton's law of cooling and Stefan's law.

UNIT VIII: Thermodynamics

- Thermal equilibrium and definition of temperature (zeroth law of Thermodynamics). Heat, work and internal energy. First law of thermodynamics. Isothermal and adiabatic processes.
- Second law of the thermodynamics: Reversible and irreversible processes. Heat engines and refrigerators.

UNIT IX: Behaviour of Perfect Gas and Kinetic Theory

- Equation of state of a perfect gas, work done on compressing a gas.
- *Kinetic theory of gases:* Assumptions, concept of pressure. Kinetic energy and temperature; degrees of freedom, law of equipartition of energy (statement only) and application to specific heat capacities of gases; concept of mean free path.

UNIT X: Oscillations and Waves

- Periodic motion-period, frequency, displacement as a function of time. Periodic functions. Simple harmonic
 motion(SHM) and its equation; phase; oscillations of a spring-restoring force and force constant; energy in SHM –Kinetic
 and potential energies; simple pendulum-derivation of expression for its time period; free, forced and damped
 oscillations (qualitative ideas only), resonance.
- Wave motion. Longitudinal and transverse waves, speed of wave motion. Displacement relation for a progressive wave.
 Principle of superposition of waves, reflection of waves, standing waves in strings and organ pipes, fundamental mode and harmonics. Beats. Doppler effect.

UNIT I: Electrostatics

- Electric charges and their conservation. Coulomb's law-force between two point charges, forces between multiple charges; superposition principle and continuous charge distribution.
- Electric field, electric field due to a point charge, electric field lines; electric dipole, electric field due to a dipole; torque on a dipole in a uniform electric field.
- Electric flux, statement of Gauss's theorem and its applications to find field due to infinitely long straight wire, uniformly charged infinite plane sheet and uniformly charged thin spherical shell (field inside and outside)
- Electric potential, potential difference, electric potential due to a point charge, a dipole and system of charges: equipotential surfaces, electrical potential energy of a system of two point charges and of electric diploes in an electrostatic field.

Conductors and insulators, free charges and bound charges inside a conductor. Dielectrics and electric polarization, capacitors and capacitance, combination of capacitors in series and in parallel, capacitance of a parallel plate capacitor with and without dielectric medium between the plates, energy stored in a capacitor, Van de Graaff generator.

UNIT II: Current Electricity

- Electric current, flow of electric charges in a metallic conductor, drift velocity and mobility, and their relation with electric current; Ohm's law, electrical resistance, *V-I* characteristics (liner and non-linear), electrical energy and power, electrical resistivity and conductivity.
- Carbon resistors, colour code for carbon resistors; series and parallel combinations of resistors; temperature dependence
 of resistance.
- Internal resistance of a cell, potential difference and emf of a cell, combination of cells in series and in parallel.
- Kirchhoff's laws and simple applications. Wheatstone bridge, metre bridge.
- Potentiometer-principle and applications to measure potential difference, and for comparing emf of two cells; measurement of internal resistance of a cell.

UNIT III: Magnetic Effects of Current and Magnetism

- Concept of magnetic field, Oersted's experiment. Biot-Savart law and its application to current carrying circular loop.
- Ampere's law and its applications to infinitely long straight wire, straight and toroidal solenoids. Force on a moving charge in uniform magnetic and electric fields. Cyclotron.
- Force on a current-carrying conductor in a uniform magnetic field. Force between two parallel current-carrying conductors-definition of ampere. Torque experienced by a current loop in a magnetic field; moving coil galvanometer-its current sensitivity and conversion to ammeter and voltmeter.
- Current loop as a magnetic dipole and its magnetic dipole moment. Magnetic dipole moment of a revolving electron. Magnetic field intensity due to a magnetic dipole (bar magnet) along its axis and perpendicular to its axis. Torque on a magnetic dipole (bar magnet) in a uniform magnetic field; bar magnet as an equivalent solenoid, magnetic field lines; Earth's magnetic field and magnetic elements.
- Para-, dia-and ferro-magnetic substances, with examples.
- Electromagnetic and factors affecting their strengths. Permanent magnets.

UNIT IV: Electromagnetic Induction and Alternating Currents

- Electromagnetic induction; Faraday's law, induced emf and current; Lenz's Law, Eddy currents. Self and mutual inductance.
- Alternating currents, peak and rms value of alternating current/ voltage; reactance and impedance; LC oscillations (qualitative treatment only), LCR series circuit, resonance; power in AC circuits, wattles current.
- AC generator and transformer.

UNIT V: Electromagnetic Waves

- Need for displacement current.
- Electromagnetic waves and their characteristics (qualitative ideas only). Transverse nature of electromagnetic waves.
- Electromagnetic spectrum (radio waves, microwaves, infrared, visible, ultraviolet, x-rays, gamma rays) including elementary facts about their uses.

UNIT VI: Optics

• Reflection of light, spherical mirrors, mirror formula. Refraction of light, total internal reflection and its applications optical fibres, refraction at spherical surfaces, lenses, thin lens formula, lens-maker's formula. Magnification, power of a

lens, combination of thin lenses in contact combination of a lens and a mirror. Refraction and dispersion of light through a prism.

- Scattering of light- blue colour of the sky and reddish appearance of the sun at sunrise and sunset.
- Optical instruments: Human eye, image formation and accommodation, correction of eye defects (myopia and hypermetropia) using lenses.
- Microscopes and astronomical telescopes (reflecting and refracting) and their magnifying powers.
- Wave optics: Wavefront and Huygens' principle, reflection and refraction of plane wave at a plane surface using wavefronts.
- Proof of laws of reflection and refraction using Huygens' principle.
- Interference, Young's double hole experiment and expression for fringe width, coherent sources and sustained interference of light.
- Diffraction due to a single slit, width of central maximum.
- Resolving power of microscopes and astronomical telescopes. Polarisation, plane polarized light; Brewster's law, uses of plane polarized light and Polaroids.

UNIT VII: Dual Nature of Matter and Radiation

- Photoelectric effect, Hertz and Lenard's observations; Einstein's photoelectric equation- particle nature of light.
- Matter waves- wave nature of particles, de Broglie relation. Davisson-Germer experiment (experimental details should be omitted; only conclusion should be explained).

UNIT VIII: Atoms and Nuclei

- Alpha- particle scattering experiments; Rutherford's model of atom; Bohr model, energy levels, hydrogen spectrum. Composition and size of nucleus, atomic masses, isotopes, isotopes.
- Radioactivity- alpha, beta and gamma particles/ rays and their properties decay law. Mass-energy relation, mass defect; binding energy per nucleon and its variation with mass number, nuclear fission and fusion.

UNIT IX: Electronic Devices

• Energy bands in solids (qualitative ideas only), conductors, insulators and semiconductors; semiconductor diode- *I-V* characteristics in forward and reverse bias, diode as a rectifier; *I-V* characteristics of LED, photodiode, solar cell, and Zener diode; Zener diode as a voltage regulator. Junction transistor, transistor action, characteristics of a transistor; transistor as an amplifier (common emitter configuration) and oscillator. Logic gates (OR, AND, NOT, NAND and NOR). Transistor as a switch.

UNIT II: Structure of Atom

Atomic number, isotopes and isobars. Concept of shells and subshells, dual nature of matter and light, de Broglie's
relationship, Heisenberg uncertainty principle, concept of orbital, quantum numbers, shapes of s,p and d orbitals, rules
for filling electrons in orbitals- Aufbau principle, Pauli exclusion principles and Hund's rule, electronic configuration of
atoms, stability of half filled and completely filled orbitals.

UNIT III: Classification of Elements and Periodicity in Properties

• Modern periodic law and long form of periodic table, periodic trends in properties of elements- atomic radii, ionization enthalpy, electron gain enthalpy, electronegativity, valence.

UNIT IV: Chemical Bonding and Molecular Structure

• Valence electrons, ionic bond, covalent bond, bond parameters, Lewis structure, polar character of covalent bond, valence bond theory, resonance, geometry of molecules, VSEPR theory, concept of hybridization involving *s*, *p* and *d* orbitals and shapes of some simple molecules, molecular orbital theory of homonuclear diatomic molecules (qualitative idea only). Hydrogen bond.

UNITV: States of Matter: Gases and Liquids

- Three states of matter, intermolecular interactions, types of bonding, melting and boiling points, role of gas laws of elucidating the concept of the molecule, Boyle's law, Charle's law, Gay Lussac's law, Avogadro's law, ideal behaviour of gases, empirical derivation of gas equation. Avogadro number, ideal gas equation. Kinetic energy and molecular speeds (elementary idea), deviation from ideal behaviour, liquefaction of gases, critical temperature.
- Liquid State- Vapour pressure, viscosity and surface tension (qualitative idea only, no mathematical derivations).

UNITVI: Thermodynamics

- First law of thermodynamics-internal energy and enthalpy, heat capacity and specific heat, measurement of U and H, Hess's law of constant heat summation, enthalpy of : bond dissociation, combustion, formation, atomization, sublimation, phase transition, ionization, solution and dilution.
- Introduction of entropy as state function, Second law of thermodynamics, Gibbs energy change for spontaneous and non-spontaneous process, criteria for equilibrium and spontaneity.
- Third law of thermodynamics- Brief introduction.

UNIT VII: Equilibrium

Equilibrium in physical and chemical processes, dynamic nature of equilibrium, law of chemical equilibrium, equilibrium constant, factors affecting equilibrium-Le Chatelier's principle; ionic equilibrium- ionization of acids and bases, strong and weak electrolytes, degree of ionization, ionization of polybasic acids, acid strength, concept of pH., Hydrolysis of salts (elementary idea)., buffer solutions, Henderson equation, solubility product, common ion effect (with illustrative examples).

UNIT VIII: Redox Reactions

• Concept of oxidation and oxidation and reduction, redox reactions oxidation number, balancing redox reactions in terms of loss and gain of electron and change in oxidation numbers.

UNIT IX: Hydrogen

• Occurrence, isotopes, preparation, properties and uses of hydrogen; hydrides-ionic, covalent and interstitial; physical and chemical properties of water, heavy water; hydrogen peroxide-preparation, reactions, uses and structure;

UNIT X: s-Block Elements (Alkali and Alkaline earth metals)

- Group I and group 2 elements:
- General introduction, electronic configuration, occurrence, anomalous properties of the first element of each group, diagonal relationship, trends in the variation of properties (such as ionization enthalpy, atomic and ionic radii), trends in chemical reactivity with oxygen, water, hydrogen and halogens; uses.

- Sodium carbonate, sodium chloride, sodium hydroxide and sodium hydrogencarbonate, biological importance of sodium and potassium.
- Industrial use of lime and limestone, biological importance of Mg and Ca.

 Adsorption-physisorption and chemisorption; factors affecting adsorption of gases on solids, catalysis homogeneous and heterogeneous, activity and selectivity: enzyme catalysis; colloidal state: distinction between true solutions, colloids and suspensions; lyophillic, lyophobic multimolecular and macromolecular colloids; properties of colloids; Tyndall effect, Brownian movement, electrophoresis, coagulation; emulsions- types of emulsions.

UNIT VI: General Principles and Processes of Isolation of Elements

• *Principles and methods of extraction-* concentration, oxidation, reduction electrolytic method and refining; occurrence and principles of extraction of aluminium, copper, zinc and iron.

UNIT VII: p- Block Elements

- Group 15 elements: General introduction, electronic configuration, occurrence, oxidation states, trends in physical and chemical properties; preparation and properties of ammonia and nitric acid, oxides of nitrogen (structure only); Phosphorous- allotropic forms; compounds of phosphorous: preparation and properties of phosphine, halides (PCI₃, PCI₅) and oxoacids (elementary idea only).

- B Cell division: Cell cycle, mitosis, meiosis and their significance.

- Respiration: Exchange gases; Cellular respiration-glycolysis, fermentation (anaerobic), TCA cycle and electron transport system (aerobic); Energy relations-Number of ATP molecules generated; Amphibolic pathways; Respiratory quotient.
- Plant growth and development: Seed germination; Phases of Plant growth and plant growth rate; Conditions of growth; Differentiation, dedifferentiation and redifferentiation; Sequence of developmental process in a plant cell; Growth regulators-auxin, gibberellin, cytokinin, ethylene, ABA; Seed dormancy; Vernalisation; Photoperiodism.
